FAST FACTS

- Founded in 1950; affiliated with the churches of Christ.
- Located in Oklahoma City, the state capital of Oklahoma and ranked among the best cities in the USA for its healthy job market and low cost of living. The university borders the city of Edmond, annually ranked as one of the best places to live by Money magazine.
- 60 undergraduate fields of study, an Honors Program, and graduate programs in accounting, business administration, computer science, engineering, divinity, ministry, theological studies, and Christianity and culture.
- 80% of students live on OC's 200-acre campus, which features new science facilities, a revamped University Center, and a \$34 million housing project completed in the last decade.
- Almost 1,800 living spaces available on campus in 12 residence halls and nine apartment complexes; more than 850 new or renovated spaces available.
- Students enjoy OC's recently launched Brew coffee shop on the second floor of the library.
- A newly renovated cafeteria will be ready for fall 2019. Students already enjoy Chick-fil-A and Alfredo's restaurants on campus.

FACULTY

- 92 full-time faculty.
- 100% Christian.
- Most faculty hold terminal degrees.
- 14-to-1 undergraduate student-to-faculty ratio. 84% of classes contain fewer than 30 students.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Ranked among the top 40 “Best Regional Universities” in the western United States by U.S. News & World Report.
- Named a Best Western College by The Princeton Review.
- One of the top 30 undergraduate game design programs in the nation (ranked by The Princeton Review and PC Gamer).
- ABET-accredited undergraduate computer, electrical, and mechanical engineering programs (One of just three members of 183-school Council for Christian Colleges and Universities with ABET accreditation for three programs).
- National History Honor Society named a “Best Chapter” award among U.S. universities with 3,000 or fewer students for 22 straight years.

OTHER ACADEMIC POINTS OF PRIDE

- High placement rates (90-100%) for accounting, biology, communication, communication design, history, interior design, language and literature, nursing, and political science, and Honors Program graduates seeking jobs or acceptance into grad school and law school.
- 90+% of OC science students who apply to graduate schools and professional schools (medical, dental, physical therapy, etc.) are accepted.
- 100% graduate school acceptance rate for OC Honors Program graduates who applied in the last four years.
- 100% job placement rate for OC interior design graduates.
- 95% job placement rate for OC public relations graduates.

ACCREDITATIONS

Oklahoma Christian is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (www.hlcommission.org, 800.621.7440). OC’s programs in business, education, engineering and computer science, interior design, music, and nursing also are nationally accredited.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

Through OC’s Ethos model for Spiritual Life, students can use their gifts and talents to grow in faith, glorify God, and serve others. Ethos encourages students to practice spiritual disciplines in five dimensions – Community, Discipleship, Discovery, Servanthood, and Worship. OC students earned more than 188,000 spiritual development credits (called “kudos”) through more than 4,000 events.

SERVICE & STUDY ABROAD

- More than 1,100 students participate in missions, ministry, and service in the USA and all around the world.
- There are 60 student organizations for students to join and lead.
- 20 study abroad and off-campus learning options, including European Studies Program headquartered in Vienna, Austria, at OC’s Das Millicanhaus. Other opportunities include study programs in the Pacific Rim and Latin America, a healthcare missions program in Honduras, and domestic and international CCCU programs.
- 20% of OC seniors have participated in a study abroad program.

ATHLETICS

- OC is a member of NCAA Division II and competes in the NCAA’s Heartland Conference.
- More than 250 student-athletes in 12 sports: men’s baseball; men’s/women’s basketball; men’s/women’s cross country; men’s/women’s golf; men’s/women’s soccer; women’s softball; men’s/women’s track and field.
- 56 national championships (29 in the last eight years).
- Placed in the top 10 in the national all-sports standings for seven straight years.
- 3.2 cumulative GPA for the entire athletic department recently (tied for #1 in Heartland Conference). Softball team won the conference academic title with a 3.49 GPA.

MASCOT & COLORS

Our “Eagles” mascot originated in 1952, two years after the school’s founding. Isaiah 40:31 has served as a theme verse through the years: “Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.” OC’s official colors are maroon and silver gray.
